Discussion:

Joseph and Mary play an important role in the Respect Life Movement in the following ways:

- Mary said "Yes" to the angel Gabriel. She was frightened when he appeared
 to her at such a young age and told her that she would be the Mother of God.
 Mary had many questions and wasn't sure what was happening at the time.
 However, Mary simply said, "Yes, let it be done to me according to Your
 word."
- Joseph was unsure about things. He didn't fully understand what was
 happening or why it was happening. He also said "Yes!" He chose to take Mary
 as his wife to love, protect and provide for her and Jesus. Joseph and Mary
 were not only Jesus' parents, but his teachers.
- Saying yes when we have doubts and fears about something is very hard to
 do. With hope in God, we can say yes to things we have fear of in our lives.
 Just as Mary said yes to God, each of our mothers say yes to being our moms
 every day. Also, just as Joseph said yes to God, our fathers say yes to being
 our dads every day. They have made a commitment to love and protect you.
- Mothers and fathers are gifts to our families as they provide for us and give
 us love and support. Let's pray for all children, that they will know that they
 always have God, the Father and Mary, our Mother in addition to their
 earthly parents.

- Read and discuss Luke 1:38.
- Why do you think Mary and Joseph made these choices?
- · Where did we all grow and thrive before we are born?
- Why do you think God gave us parents?
- What are some things your parents do to help you? Think about the physical, spiritual, and emotional gifts your parents share with you.
- How can you show your parents how much you love and appreciate them?



Activity: Cards and Kisses Activity

- · Have each student put their Hershey Kisses in their bag.
- On their card, have them complete "I love giving hugs and kisses to my mom/dad when...."
- Have the students complete the Spiritual Bouquet Card and include that with the Mother's Day and Father's Day card.



School Closing Activity: Rainbow of Life

- As Christians, we believe that the rainbow was God's Covenant Promise to Noah that the world would never have a great flood again.
- This is such an incredible promise by God.
- Assign each classroom/grade a specific color of the rainbow, so all the colors are represented.
- Sketch a large rainbow on a white bulletin board paper or cloth.
- Map out where each color should be placed.
- Have students paint their hands the specific color assigned to their class and place their hands on the rainbow.
- As they make handprints, have each student say "Thank you, God, for saving lives."
- This rainbow represents all of the lives saved by the students' prayers and actions throughout the year.

 When the rainbow is complete, display it in a place where everyone can see it. (TrendEnterprises.com)
